**NOTICE OF COMBINED MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM STAY
AND ABANDONMENT, AND NOTICE UPON CONVERSION TO
CHAPTER 7**

Effective Monday, March 5, 2007, the following changes will be implemented to CM/ECF:

1. Combined Motions for Relief from Stay and Abandonment. In the Motions/Applications event list, an event called Abandonment & Relief from Stay combines the Motion for Abandonment and the Motion for Relief from Stay events. For statistical purposes, these events are tracked separately. Choosing the combined event is now equivalent to selecting both the Abandonment and the Relief from Stay events at the same time. When the combined event is now used, the filer may notice a slight change in the prompts and the resulting docket text. Since Abandonments and Relief from Stays are now tracked separately, it is important to select the combined event rather than adding the words "Abandonment" or "Relief from Stay" at the end of the Abandonment or Relief from Stay individual events. If the wrong event is selected, a deficiency notice will be issued.

2. Notice Upon Conversion to Chapter 7. When a case converts to Chapter 7, the Clerk will issue a notice reminding the debtor of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure requirements to file additional documents. Those documents may include the statement of intention, a schedule of post-petition debts, and a Form B22A. This notice replaces docket text which gave a partial list of required documents.
