AVAILABILITY OF OPINIONS DATABASE

MORTGAGE RESTRUCTURING OPTION

1. Cover Sheet no longer needed for Adversary Proceedings filed electronically. Parties filing adversary proceedings electronically no longer need to submit a cover sheet, Official Form B104. Required Information is captured through the filing process. Parties filing adversary proceedings 'on paper' are required to submit a cover sheet.
2. Opinions Database Available. The Court has developed a database of its opinions. A link to that database has been placed on the main page of the Court's website and can also be found under the "Publications/Resources" tab - <http://www.insb.uscourts.gov/Opinions/opinsert.htm>. The main page lists the two most recent opinions for each Judge and includes a brief description and the pivotal statutory or rules cites. An available search engine allows searches by case, number topic, or Judge. (Read the instructions for crafting your search carefully.) While the database includes hundreds of opinions, only the most recent opinions have been given a summary description. All new opinions will have a summary, so the ability to conduct productive searches of the database will improve over time.
3. Mortgage Restructuring Option. The Court has received a press release about a new way for debtors' counsel to submit to mortgage lenders loss mitigation and mortgage modification proposals for clients both in and out of bankruptcy. The web portal is developed and operated by Default Mitigation Management LLC (DMM). The portal began as a pilot program in a few areas, but became available nationwide as of January 1st.
