**ON-LINE CM/ECF REGISTRATION AND ON-LINE CM/ECF TRAINING  
LAUNCHED; NEW OPTION FOR FILING, AMENDING, AND  
WITHDRAWING PROOFS OF CLAIM**

June 3<sup>rd</sup> is the launch date for several new applications designed to assist the Court's customers. First, the process of obtaining a CM/ECF log-in and password has gone electronic. Attorneys and limited users who need to register to use CM/ECF in this District must now start the process on-line. A link to start the registration process appears on the Court's main Web page on the upper left side of the page under Electronic Case Filing (ECF).

The new registration process includes on-line training modules. Those modules are also made available as 'refresher' training opportunities for experienced users or their staff. The modules can be found on the same menu. The link is titled Refresher Learning Modules. Check out these modules at this direct link:

Finally, the Court has added options for filing and amending proofs of claim ('ePOC') and for withdrawing proofs of claim ('eWOC'). These tools are in addition to the use of CM/ECF or delivery of paper documents for filing, amending, or withdrawing claims (by those permitted to do so). Use of ePOC or eWOC does NOT require an ECF log-in and password. Since ePOC or eWOC results in a filing with an electronic signature, pertinent sections of the ECF Administrative Policies and Procedures Manual have been edited to apply to these new options.

These new claims filing tools can be found on the left side navigation of our main page and is labeled Claims.

See also the Court's separate [announcement](#) about changes to block scheduling of certain Chapter 13 matters, distributed last week. That scheduling tool now applies in the Evansville and Terre Haute divisions.
