ORDER

Review of the Court's records reveals that many previously issued general orders have been implicitly rescinded or superseded by local rules or other general orders. Some general orders adopt changes to the local rules, but remain posted on the Court's website even after those local rules edits become effective. The posting of obsolete general orders on the Court's website makes review of those general orders difficult.

Accordingly, the Court now orders that:

1. The following general orders are still in effect as of this date:

- 03-0011: procedure for prepackaged Chapter 11 cases
- 09-0003: mandatory electronic filing for attorneys
- 09-0004: wage assignment orders in Chapter 13 cases
- 09-0005: treatment of current mortgage payments in Chapter 13 plans
- 09-0006: requiring proof of identification for pro se parties filing documents
- 09-0011: requiring electronic filing by non-attorneys
- 10-0001: informal dispute resolution requirement for New Albany Chapter 13 cases
- 11-0002: concerning the deposit and investment of registry funds
- 12-0001: setting the maximum counsel fee for Chapter 13 cases
- 12-0005: establishing the schedule for installment fees
- 12-0006: adopting the latest version of interim rule 1007-I

2. General orders adopting changes to the local rules remain effective, but shall be archived and removed from view to the public 30 days after the effective date of the rules changes in those orders. The current version of the local rules always supersedes any earlier general order.

3. A general order rescinding another general order, and the order that is rescinded, shall both be archived and removed from view to the public 30 days after the issuance of the order rescinding.

4. All other general orders are hereby rescinded, and shall be archived and removed from view to the public on the Court's website if posted there. Any paper versions of these General Orders shall be retained by the Clerk after being marked "Rescinded."
