(1) The following general orders are still in effect as of this date:

- 10-0001: directing informal dispute resolution in Chapter 13 cases (New Albany Division only)
- 12-0006: adopted the latest version of interim rule 1007-I
- 16-0004: regarding deposit and investment of registry funds
- 18-0001: refunding fees
- 20-0002: concerning temporary waiver of signature requirement on debtor's documents
- 20-0004: concerning evidence at telephonic hearings
- 20-0010: installment fees payment schedule
- 21-0001: highly sensitive document procedures
- 21-0002: mandatory electronic filing by non-attorneys
- 22-0002: refund procedure for erroneous Pay.gov forms service payments
- 22-0003: Ch. 13 loss mitigation program
- 22-0004: Ch. 13 Presumed Reasonable fee

(2) General orders adopting changes to the local rules remain effective, but shall be archived and removed from the General Orders page of the Court's website 30 days after the effective date of the rules changes in those orders.
