UPDATE ON ORDER DISTRIBUTION PROCESS

After a few weeks' experience with the new order distribution process, the Judges have decided to make a few additional changes.

- 1. All reference to the filing of a certificate of service by the party charged with making distribution has been removed from docket text and Court-generated orders. Counsel are welcome to file certificates of service to create a record as to their distribution, but the Court is not requiring that filing.
- 2. The Court will soon resume responsibility for distributing any order that denies a request for relief and also orders on reaffirmation agreements. In any case, the Judge may also direct that an order provided by a party be distributed by the Court rather than counsel.
- 3. The term 'prevailing party' in the direction to make distribution will be replaced, when possible, with more specific identifiers such as 'trustee,' 'creditor [name]', 'debtor' using the role type assigned the entity by CM/ECF.
